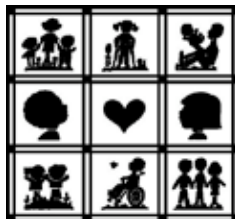

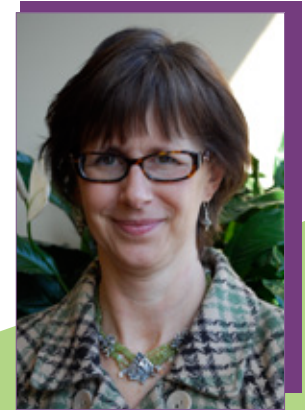

Pamela Lowell is a licensed clinical social worker with over twenty years of experience in counseling adolescents and their families. She has worked at residential treatment centers, schools, mental health clinics and currently is in private practice. In 2008, she received a Community Partner award from Adoption Rhode Island, and now serves as a clinical consultant for their staff. Pamela is also the author of *Spotting for Nellie*, and *Returnable Girl*, (Marshall Cavendish 2006) a popular paperback for 2010 and her award-winning young-adult novel about a teen in foster care who must choose between the woman who wants to adopt her and the mother who abandoned her amidst the drama of middle school.
